

## Introduction

The PE & Sport Premium grant is a sum of money in the school's budget based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6.

Our grant for academic year 2023-24 was **£16,790**, plus a carry forward of **£335.02** from last year, giving a **total of £17125.02**

At St George's we use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport we offer.

The 5 key indicators that we aim to improve are:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity (the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school);
- the profile of PE/sport and outdoor learning is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement;
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of staff involved in teaching or assisting PE and sport;
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
- increased participation in competitive sport.

We typically use our funding to:

- provide staff with professional development, mentoring, training and resources to help them teach and support PE and sport more effectively;
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers and teaching assistants to enhance or extend current opportunities;
- introduce new sports or other activities to encourage more pupils to take up sport and physical activities;
- support and involve the least active children by providing targeted activities, and running lunchtime and after school sports clubs;
- enter sport competitions with other local schools;
- encourage pupils to take on leadership or volunteer roles that support sport and physical activity within the school;
- embed physical activity into the school day through active playgrounds and active teaching.
